Charles Katz was a rather unsavory character who was involved in an illegal gambling operation. To further his betting, he regularly used a particular payphone on a particular street in Los Angeles to make phone calls to Miami and Boston. The F.B.I. suspected Katz of running the gambling operation and, thus, placed an electronic surveillance device (a "bug") on the payphone to record his calls. Based on the calls, Katz was arrested and in court he challenged the use of the calls saying that his Fourth Amendment rights were violated by the "search" of his conversations. Katz claimed he has a reasonable expectation of privacy in the conversations.
